### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### PRINCIPAL MATTERS

2018 is off to a wonderful start. The **Year 7 camp** was an exciting initiation for Year 7 students and by now all students have settled into the routine of classes and school life. School is a place of learning and I do hope students have thought about what they would like to learn this year, where they need to focus their energies and have thought about how they can be the best possible learner.

Staff changes. There have been a number of staff changes this year. The new Head Teacher HSIE is Ms R. Senthevadivel replacing Mr Gersbach who retired in 2017. New appointments in the HSIE faculty also include Mrs A Bird, Mr J Muller, Mr J. Hayton, Mr T.Tan, and Mrs C Cinque; in Science we have Mrs A Ashfaq, Ms I. Marchant and Mr A. Azim.In CAPA we are very pleased to have Ms N Lister in Visual Arts and Mr W. Duong in Music. Ms Koranyi is now permanently in Careers as our Careers Adviser and we welcome back Ms M Sammes who is relieving for Ms Tripodi while she is on Maternity Leave. We are also expecting a new Chaplain to relieve for Mrs C Freitag while she is on maternity leave.

The value of these scholarships is around \$25,000 which includes a leadership skill development program and a six month mentoring program with a community leader. The Academy, at Macquarie University, focuses on developing leadership skills and broadens students' perspectives of banking and the finance industry.

Jesmond Connolly Borg, Year 12 continues his journey through leadership not just at school but in the wider community. He has been selected from 4,000 students across the nation to attend the Constitutional Convention in Canberra later in the month. An outstanding achievement and we look forward to hearing of Jesmond's experiences.

The Senior Prefects under the guidance of Mrs Kennaugh along with the Librarian are planning to celebrate Northmead CAPA High International Women's Day on the 8<sup>th</sup> of March. We look forward to this important celebration of Women and their achievements. 
## YR 7 CAMP







#### Science News Update 1:

The science faculty starts its year with lots of Chemistry!

Year 12 prepare for their HSC journey with a variety of experiments to accentuate their learning experience and reinforce their learning.







Year 11 Biology head off to Penrith lakes to investigate Ecosystem Dynamics as part of their in-depth studies on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> March. This unique and highly engaging program allows students to perform a first-hand investigation to measure a range of abiotic and biotic factors in a freshwater ecosystem using various scientific equipment and data collection methods. Students measure populations of organisms using sampling techniques. Students then analyse the data collected and observe the abiotic-biotic relationships that exist and their interdependence. An example of a recent local extinction event through predation is explained. There is also a look at past and future ecosystems at Penrith Lakes.

SCIENCE NEWS

As for our newest members; Year 7 students begin their scientific journey here at NCAPAHS with safety in mind! As they settle into the high school environment, they are introduced to science with 'Being a Scientist' as their first topic which is an important topic that ensures students are aware of the safety aspects in the science lab.

This topic also comes hand in hand with their first cross curricula PBL task 'Safety', which allows students to immerse themselves in 21<sup>st</sup> century skills and take ownership of their learning.

## COMMUNITY NEWS-SAFETY ZONES

#### Reinforcing safety in school zones

8 February 2018

Seven new school zone offences enforced from 1 February 2018.

To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic offences with new fines.

None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but now in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

- 1. Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 2. Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- 4. Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
- 6. Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
- 7. Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.

#### **Bicycle Policy**

Students wishing to ride their bicycle to school need to read the following and return the second page of this document with their parent's signature to the Front office.

Parents and carers are responsible for how their child travels to and from school. However, under duty of care, schools are responsible for the student once they have entered the school premises.

Since July 1 1991, cyclists of all ages have been required by law to wear a helmet. By law, all riders and passengers must wear an Australian and New Zealand Standards (AS/NZ2063) approved helmet. Helmets need to be securely fitted and fastened on the rider's head. Advice on how to correctly fit a helmet can be found in the RTA publication *Information for parents and carers about safety on wheels*.

Students wishing to cycle home from sport during school time must have the Principal's written permission and must **WALK** their bike to the venue and in the company of the teacher on duty. Once dismissed from the activity they must wear an Australian and New Zealand Standards (AS/NZ2063) approved helmet. Students without these helmets may not take part in cycling, on or off school grounds.

Children under 12 years, by law, are allowed to ride bicycles on the footpath unless there are signs that specifically prohibit cycling. Children aged between 10 and 12 years old should avoid cycling on busy roads (for example Windsor Rd). The Department of Education and Communities supports the RTA in this recommendation.

Cyclists over 12 years must not ride on the footpath unless it is signposted as a shared footpath. Cyclists, just as other road users, must comply with all road rules.

By law, bicycles must be fitted with a working brake and bell. This is a parent and carer responsibility.

Schools are obliged to notify parents and carers when a student is seen to be not wearing or incorrectly wearing a bicycle helmet when riding to or from school.

Once a student arrives at the school gates/boundary they must dismount from their bicycle and **WALK** the bicycle to the caged area adjacent to the Front office. They must provide their own lock to secure their property.

Although the school can provide an area for storage it cannot accept responsibility for theft or damage.

At the end of the school day, students put on their helmet and **WALK** their bicycle to the front gate or school boundary at which point they can then mount the bicycle for their journey home.
